Please note for question(s) 4(c), (d) and (e) a music teacher is required to snap or tap as indicated at appropriate points in the excerpt as detailed on page 7 of this transcript.

Please note for question 8, the candidate is required to snap or tap as indicated at appropriate points in the excerpt as detailed on pages 17 and 18 of this transcript. The music teacher must detail on what line of the lyrics the candidate indicated their snap or tap. The lyrics are provided on page 19 of this transcript.

- (c) During the third playing your teacher will indicate with a snap or tap where bar 6 begins. What is the value of the first note in this bar?
- Your teacher will indicate with a snap or a tap where bar 19 begins.

 Name the chord you hear in bar 19 and the next chord in bar 21.

 The chord used in bars 17 and 18 is C chord V.

Dm Chord VI

- Your teacher will indicate with a snap or a tap where bar 24 begins. At the end of bar 24 what Italian term would be used to tell the performer to go back to bar 1?
- (f) The music is in the key of F major. What is the letter name of the dominant note in this key?

The music will be played **six** more times with a pause of **45 seconds** between playings and a pause of **3 minutes** before the next question starts. During the next six playings you should complete your answers (a) to (f).

During this first hearing do not attempt to answer any of the questions.

You should indicate with a snap or a tap when you hear the features occur in the music. Your music teacher has a copy of the lyrics and will inform you of the line number where you indicated the snap or tap for each feature of the music.

There will now be a pause of one minute before the first playing of the music.

There is a pause of 1 minute.

Here is the music for the first time. Indicate with a snap or a tap when you hear a perfect cadence.

There is a pause of 20 seconds.
