Response:

A Scottish Government spokesperson said:

"Marking of exams is an operational matter for the SQA in its independent role as an examination body. As in previous years, SQA will be undertaking an evaluation of their awarding approaches.

"We are reforming our education bodies to ensure they better meet the needs of learners. Legislation has been introduced to create a new national qualifications body, Qualifications Scotland, which will put the knowledge and experience of pupils and teachers at the heart of decisions around qualifications and assessment."

As I said on the phone, if you put this in front of Jenny she'll understand it because it's not that different to Modern Studies marking. Basically, even though the marking scheme for this year might look the same as last year, it seems that the principal assessor and marking team decided that students have to be more specific than has been the case in the past in order to get marks. That means that students didn't do as well as previous years, or as well as expected, and because there is no traditional appeals process there's nothing that can be done about it.

I've spoken to various teachers, including current markers who were in the room, and they're telling me the same thing again and again: the SQA moved the goalposts for marking after the exams.

The SQA says 'nothing to see here' but that's obviously not true, unless we're willing to believe that a 26% drop in the mean score for an exam paper, making the average performance a fail, is perfectly normal.

One teacher got in touch with me today after reading our story and said that they SQA has "lied on the record".

Obviously, all of this has had a potentially life-changing impact on a significant number of students across Scotland, especially with history being one of the more popular subjects at Higher.

There will be young people who have lost out on university places because of this change in the marking approach.

Given all of this, and given that the SQA was previously deemed so dysfunction that it had to be scrapped, with the Scottish Government / education secretary actually step in and do anything to protect students in this instance?





Good morning.

We are planning to run some follow up to our story about the problems with Higher History marking this year.

Since publishing our original story, I have been approached by many more teachers, including current markers, who have confirmed that there were changes to marking standards this year. I have also received a significant number of messages raising major concerns about the culture at the SQA, especially around the history team up to and including and also .

I have also approached the government to ask if they plan to step in given the concerns raised by whistle-blowers and the potential impact on young people. They have responded saying that the SQA itself will review what has happened, which we are planning to report. I will also be reporting the additional comments from teachers and SQA appointees, which include explicit rejections of the SQA position to this point.

Does the SQA still wish to stick to its position that there is no problem whatsoever with Higher History marking for this year, even given the contributions of teachers/markers?
